A collective agreement is a written contract between the employer (SCDSB) and a union (SCEOT) that outlines many of the terms and conditions of employment for employees in a bargaining unit. The terms are reached through collective bargaining between the employer and the union.

This agreement is a <u>legal document and if you violate our agreement you could potentially face discipline.</u> Please remember, **SCHEDULE A** is also part of our collective agreement and you are responsible to understand these documents.
