Flourish with French (Grades 4-8)

Spend time going over *Flourish with French*, a great resource for OTs not qualified in French. This resource has five self-contained units focusing on: Geometry, The Solar System, Calendar, Clothing and The Future. Each lesson plan has instructions in English. The instructions for delivery of lessons are clearly defined for grades 4, 5/6, and 7/8. Each unit includes tip boxes/strategies to allow for modification/adaptation of lesson plans.

Flourish with French is a curriculum resource created specifically for Occasional Teachers in Ontario not qualified in FSL. The five curriculum-related units can be used with Core French classes, grades 4-8 and some sections with French Immersion classes.

There is also a section dealing with some basics of the French language, for teachers whose background does not include exposure to the French language. This section serves too, as a refresher for those with limited French. A simple phonetic guide to pronunciation and very comprehensive lesson plans will provide Occasional Teachers with a rich and reliable resource to start using immediately.
